What is **PROMIS**?

PROMIS (Patient-Reported Outcomes Measurement Information System[®]) is a set of person-centered measures that evaluates and monitors physical, mental, and social health. The PROMIS family of measures includes more than 550 tools to self-assess the health of adults and children. The measures can be used with the general population and with individuals living with chronic conditions.

PROMIS measures are used around the world and available in English, Spanish and many other languages.

PROMIS is rapidly becoming the global standard in registries, value-based care, clinical sites of service, electronic health records, and population health initiatives. PROMIS measures are generating real world evidence, being administered in clinical trials, and undergoing FDA COA qualification.

What is the PROMIS Health Organization (PHO)?

The PROMIS Health Organization (PHO) is a growing international organization that welcomes innovative leaders who are integrating the patient's voice in research, clinical care, and healthcare initiatives. PHO members are clinicians, researchers, healthcare and regulatory professionals. They work in hospitals, clinics, academia, private practice, the technology and pharmaceutical industries, and government agencies around the world. They are working to bring the patient's voice to the forefront of healthcare utilizing PROMIS measures.

The PHO is advancing the science of health outcomes assessment by promoting widespread use and education on using PROMIS measures in clinical practice and research.


